



Fall 2013 Concurrent Enrollment Partnership (CEP) Program MA 116 - College Algebra & COMPASS Exam Information

Students must have a **minimum 3.0 GPA** and the approval of the high school (and their parent or legal guardian if under 18 years of age) to enroll in the MA 116 concurrent enrollment course. Students must also have achieved **a score of 22 or higher on the ACT Math Exam or the equivalent COMPASS Exam score**. 9th grade students must have a gifted designation to participate in CEP courses, and both 9th and 10th grade students must have the approval of the WU College of Arts & Sciences to participate.

The COMPASS Math Exam may be taken on the WU campus on the dates listed below. The exam normally takes less than an hour to complete.

Students must register and pay the \$15 exam fee online at least one week prior to the exam date at:

**You must include your Washburn Identification Number (WIN) or high school ID number to register
A photo ID (a driver's license or school ID) must be provided by the student at the start of the exam.**

Students will be notified immediately after completing the exam whether or not they are eligible to enroll in the MA 116 College Algebra CEP course, and their high school CEP liaisons will also be notified.

The Washburn Testing Office will approve a request for a **single** retake of a portion of the COMPASS when there is substantial reason to believe that a meaningful change in the student's preparation has occurred. In general, retesting should not be scheduled until a full 30 days has elapsed to provide for sufficient opportunity for intervening learning/instruction.
