Tentative and Abbreviated Day to Day Itinerary / Schedule

Friday, May 24, Day 1 - TOPEKA / KANSAS CITY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT / SEATTLE

Meet the other members of the Washburn Alumni Association as you prepare to board your motorcoach at the Washburn campus to take you to the Kansas City International Airport. Depart on Alaska Air (AS) flight 759 non-stop to Seattle. Arrive the Seattle – Tacoma (SeaTac) International Airport. Upon arrival your private motorcoach will take you on a brief tour of Seattle prior to arriving at your hotel for the next two nights. Overnight: Warwick Hotel – Seattle

Saturday, May 25, Day 2 - SEATTLE (B,D)



Breakfast at your hotel. This morning expand on last night's sightseeing of one of the Pacific Northwest's fastest growing cities. Among a variety of sights included is a short stop at the Hiram Chittenden Locks, the city center, sports complex, International District, Montlake Cut, Lake Union, unique bridges, Fisherman's Terminal, Fremont Statues, Queen Anne neighborhood and Kerry Park. Later continue the short distance to Woodinville, the heart of the Washington wine scene. An expert on Northwest wine will guide the group to 2-3 wineries for tastings and will share his knowledge of Washington wines. The group will make a stop with lunch on your own. Later, return to the hotel and freshen up before tonight's activities. Depart your hotel for a 4-hour adventure beginning with an Argosy cruise on Puget

Sound to Blake Island. On the island, enjoy a buffet meal and an enchanting show performed in the spirit of Northwest Coast Indians. Afterwards, return to your hotel by motorcoach. Overnight: Warwick Hotel – Seattle

Sunday, May 26, Day 3 - SEATTLE / MOUNT RAINIER / SEATTLE (B)

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning head south towards one of the Pacific Northwest's most famous landmarks, Mt. Rainier National Park. This full day excursion includes the awe-inspiring adventure on the Mt. Rainier Gondola. Travel along the Chinook Pass Scenic Byway, experiencing old growth forests, towering peaks, spectacular views of Mt. Rainier and numerous streams, lakes and waterfalls. Later, return to Seattle. The balance of the evening is free. Overnight: Warwick Hotel – Seattle

Monday, May 27, Day 4 - SEATTLE / VICTORIA / BUTCHART GARDENS

Early morning departure from the hotel to the Victoria Clipper terminal. Board the "Victoria Clipper" and have breakfast on board while cruising Puget Sound into the Strait of San Juan de Fuca to Victoria Island in British Columbia, Canada. Arrive Victoria's Clipper Terminal and embark on a narrated city tour including the world famous Butchart Gardens, one of the most popular attractions in the Victoria area. Later, your private motorcoach will take you to your home for the next two nights, the Fairmont Empress Hotel, perhaps the city's most impressive structure. The balance of the day and evening is at leisure. Overnight: The Fairmont Empress Hotel – Victoria

Tuesday, May 28, Day 5 - VICTORIA (B)

Breakfast at your hotel. Day at leisure to go exploring. Included this afternoon, a totally British experience, High Tea at the Fairmont Empress Hotel. Overnight: The Fairmont Empress Hotel - Victoria

Wednesday, May 29, Day 6 - VICTORIA / VANCOUVER

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning travel by private motorcoach to later take a 90 minute ferry ride across the Strait of Georgia to Vancouver, B. C. Enjoy a buffet lunch on board the ferry. Upon arrival, go on tour of Vancouver. Sightseeing highlights include: Stanley Park, Vancouver Waterfront, Gastown, Downtown and more. Afterward, your motorcoach will take you to your hotel for the next two nights. The balance of the day is free. Overnight: Listel Hotel – Vancouver

Thursday, May 30, Day 7 - VANCOUVER (B)

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning enjoy a railroad excursion on the Rocky Mountaineer “Sea to Sky Climb” from Vancouver to Whistler, host of the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. During your three and a half hour train trip you’ll travel through the scenic Howe Sound and the Cheakamus Canyon and past the snow-capped peaks of the Tantalus Mountains, before arriving in Whistler Village. The absence of cars and abundance of cozy cafes, boutiques and gourmet restaurants give Whistler the look and feel of an idyllic European mountain village. The afternoon is free for browsing and enjoying the ambiance before your private motorcoach returns to Vancouver. The balance of the evening is free. Overnight: Listel Hotel – Vancouver

Friday, May 31, Day 8 - VANCOUVER (B)

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning, return to the USA from Vancouver, crossing the Canadian Border, and continuing back to Seattle. Upon arrival at your hotel, the balance of the day has been made available for you to do what you would like in Seattle. Overnight: Warwick Hotel - Seattle

Saturday, June 1, Day 9 - SEATTLE / KANSAS CITY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT / TOPEKA (B)

Breakfast at your hotel. Early morning departure for the SeaTac Airport for check in with the Alaska Air ticket counter for your flight home. Depart on AS 758 non-stop to Kansas City. Arrive Kansas City’s International Airport. Upon arrival, meet your motorcoach to take you to the Washburn campus.

The following features are included in the per person cost:

- Private deluxe motorcoach between the Washburn Campus in Topeka and the Kansas City International Airport
- Roundtrip air travel between Kansas City International and SeaTac International Airport on Alaska Airlines
- Private deluxe motorcoach transportation throughout the tour as outlined in the day to day itinerary below
- Eight (8) nights centrally located first and superior first class accommodations with three nights in Seattle at the [Warwick Hotel](#), 2 nights in Victoria at the [Fairmont Empress Hotel](#) and 2 nights in Vancouver at the [Listel Hotel](#)
- Breakfast each morning while on tour
- All applicable local taxes, service charges and luggage handling for one (1) piece of luggage while on tour (airline taxes subject to change)
- A final tour packet for each tour member to include a letter of instruction, tourist information, luggage tags, travel insurance form and other information pertaining to the tour

Terms and Conditions:

Deposit and Full Payment - A deposit of \$250 per person along with a completed reservation form are required to confirm your reservation for the tour based on a first come first served basis. Deposits and final payments may be made by check or credit card. Final payment by credit card will incur an \$80 convenience fee. Final payment will be due no later than Friday, January 4, 2013.

Please Note – The features and price* outlined are based on a minimum number of full-paying passengers participating in the program. Costs are subject to change pending any currently unforeseen increases in existing tariffs and/or government taxes or airline fuel surcharges.

Cancellation - In the event of an individual cancellation, the following cancellation policy will apply: for any cancellation prior to Friday, January 4, 2013, a \$50 per person cancellation penalty will apply. After Friday, January 4 up to and including travel during the tour, and "no-shows" will be subject to a 100% cancellation penalty.

Travel Insurance – Travel insurance is highly recommended as extra protection for accident, medical, sickness, baggage and personal possessions, trip cancellation and interruption. Travel Leaders can provide insurance forms and assist you in obtaining travel insurance.

Documentation IMPORTANT - All tour members are required to have a valid U.S. Passport with a minimum of 6 months validity upon returning to the United States.
