

2010 Syllabus for AP European History

July 26 – 30, 2010

Institute Overview

This course will offer methodology and topical studies for the new and experienced AP European History teacher. We will cover the basics of the European history exam, discuss and practice a wide variety of classroom strategies, study a variety of European history topics, share lessons and strategies, take a field trip and use computer time for collegial work on new lessons.

Institute Goals

The fundamental goal of the institute is to provide an overview of a college-level introductory course in European history with an emphasis on practical, effective classroom strategies. Steps to accomplish this are threefold:

- First, to outline the basics of the national European history exam, including its structure and scoring
- Second, to share classroom strategies and topical studies that support the course
- Third, to have practical experience in sharing and creating lessons that will give the teacher a wide array of lessons and strategies for his/her course.

Consultant Background



Patti Harrold is social studies department chair at Edmond Memorial High School in Edmond, Oklahoma, where she has taught AP European History, AP Art History, AP World History and AP U.S. History. She has taught for 35 years, primarily in Edmond, but also in Klein ISD and North Forest ISD, both in the Houston area. Ms. Harrold is a National Board certified teacher, an AP Reader for European History and has been a College Board consultant for 18 years, presenting at more than 50 College Board and AP workshops and week-long summer institutes. She has written and edited many publications for AP histories and has recently worked with the Teaching American History grant program and served on a History Channel grant committee. She received the College Board's Southwestern Region AP Special Recognition Award and the National Council for the Social Studies Secondary Teacher of the Year award in 2004. Ms. Harrold holds a BA from Oklahoma City University and an MS from Lamar University.
