KEEP YOUR WORK AREA CLEAN!!!!

- Keep hand sanitizer and facial tissues near your work desk. If you do not work at a desk, put travel sizes of these items in your pocket. Sanitizer and tissues will come in handy when you're ill and can also prevent the spread of germs resulting from touching dirty items, such as money and computer keyboards.
- Trim your nails regularly, especially if you work in the food service industry. Trimmed nails will allow you to keep your hands much cleaner, and prevent the spread of germs to the food you handle.
- Wash your hands thoroughly after each restroom visit. To prevent contaminating your hands again on the way out of the restroom, open the door with a paper towel and dispose of it at your work station or a nearby trashcan
- Clean up after yourself is shared common areas. Leaving wrappers and trash can spread germs; let's keep our fellow workers health and pick up after ourselves.

Flu recommendations

- CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine for everyone 6 months of age and older as the first and most important step in protecting against this serious disease. While there are many different flu viruses, the seasonal flu vaccine is designed to protect against the main flu viruses that research suggests will cause the most illness during the upcoming flu season. People should begin getting vaccinated soon after flu vaccine becomes available, ideally by October, to ensure that as many people as possible are protected before flu season begins.
- In addition to getting vaccinated, you can take <u>everyday preventive</u> <u>actions(http://www.cdc.gov/flu/protect/habits/index.htm)</u> like staying away from sick people and washing your hands to reduce the spread of germs. If you are sick with flu, stay home from work or school to prevent spreading flu to others.
