NOTE: Candidates pursuing an initial teaching license (***Elementary K-6, Secondary 6-12, All Levels P-12 must apply for and be granted *Formal Admission* to the Professional Teacher Education Program before being allowed to enroll in any upper division (300-400 level) Professional Teacher Education courses.**

Admission's Requirements

Degree Seeking Candidates: Elementary K-6, Secondary 6-12, and All Levels P-12

V Grade Point Average/Exam Requirements:

General Education – GPA of 2.75 or better in **24 credit hours of required** general education courses. Some general education courses have been designated as **collateral courses**. **Students must obtain a grade of C or better in the following collateral courses: EN 101 & MA 116. See individual licensure plans for additional collateral courses.**

Teaching Specialty –Elementary (K-6), Secondary (6-12) & All Levels(P-12) students at the time of application to the Professional Teacher Education Program and to Student Teaching must earn a grade of C or better in each specialty/content course.

Professional Sequence – All students must earn a grade of C or better in the required professional sequence courses. (continued on next page)

Cumulative GPA – An overall cumulative GPA of 2.50 or better for **ALL** courses attempted.

Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) – Official copies of PPST scores submitted to the Department of Education, with minimum acceptable scores of: **Writing 172; Reading 173; and Mathematics 172.**

*Students pursuing an Elementary K-6 degree must select and complete one of 5 emphasis areas. These include: Early Childhood Unified Birth-3rd, Middle School English 5-8, Middle School Math 5-8, Middle School History 5-8, and Adaptive Special Education K-6.

Licensure Only Candidates: Elementary K-6, Secondary 6-12, and All Levels P-12

Teacher candidates with a BA or BS from an accredited institution must meet the following admission requirements:

I General Education

Licensure only candidates must meet all supportive and/or prerequisite courses required by a specific teaching license.

Elementary licensure only candidates may select and complete the k-6 level program. A second licensure area is optional.

To Obtain Formal Admission

Each candidate must complete the following steps:

1. File a Declaration of Major Form and/or a Declaration of Teacher Licensure Form.

Elementary K-6: Complete and file a *Declaration of Major* form online (*My Washburn--Students* tab--*Declare or Change Your Major*). When you file your *Declaration* form, a faculty member in the Department of Education will be assigned to advise you regarding: (a) general education and (b) professional education requirements.

Secondary 6-12 and P-12 Subject Majors: File a *Declaration of Major* form online (*My Washburn—Students* tab—*Declare or Change your Major*). **Make sure you select the correct major** (e.g., History Education, instead of History). You will be assigned an advisor from your major department who will advise you regarding requirements to complete the major and general education requirements, and an advisor in the Department of education who will advise you regarding professional education requirements.

Licensure Only Candidates: Elementary K-6, Secondary 6-12, and P-12: File a *Declaration of Certification/Teacher Licensure* form online (*My Washburn—Students* tab—*Declare or Change your Major*). Select *Teacher Licensure Only* as your degree and then select your teaching specialty. You will be assigned an advisor from your teaching specialty department who will advise you regarding requirements in the teaching specialty, and an advisor in the Department of Education who will advise you regarding professional education requirements.

2. File an Application for Admission to the Professional Teacher Education Program. Complete the attached Admissions Application form.

Review of Applications: Application materials may be submitted for review three times a year: **August 1, November 1, and April 1**. All application materials must be submitted by the application date. Upon review of application materials, the Undergraduate Admission Committee will either recommend or deny admission to a teacher licensure program. Candidates will be notified in writing regarding their admissions status. **Licensure candidates not admitted will have to resubmit an application for a subsequent admissions review.**

Questions and/or Right of Appeal: You will be notified in writing of any action taken by the Faculty of the Department of Education. Any time you have any questions regarding requirements for admission or the status of your application for admission, you should not hesitate to consult with your Professional Education Advisor, the Licensure Officer in the Department of Education Office, or the Department of Education Chairperson. Department and University policies assure that you have the right to appeal any decision that may affect your academic status and to correct any error of record that may occur inadvertently. Informal appeals may be made verbally to the Chairperson of the Department of Education. Formal appeals should be made in writing and submitted to the Chairperson of the Department of Education. Formal appeals are referred to the Faculty of the Department of Education. Every effort is made to assure that student records and applications for admission are handled accurately, promptly and professionally.

To obtain formal admission to STUDENT TEACHING a 2.75 GPA will be required for both Specialty Courses and Professional Courses at the time of Admission. Students must earn a grade of C or better in each specialty/content course and Professional Education Courses. This requirement pertains to both degree seeking students and licensure only students.
