Note 2: Collateral courses – a grade of “C” or better is required in each of these courses.

Note 3: EN 300 – Advanced Composition – Teaching Emphasis is required of all degree-seeking candidates.

Note 4: No more than 6 hours may be counted from any one discipline for Social Science and Humanities general education requirements. Two disciplines other than Mathematics are required for the Mathematics/Natural Science general education requirement. All general education electives must be selected from the Approved General Education courses. See University Catalog.

\*Students seeking a 6-12 Adaptive Special Education Provisional license may complete the following courses as they complete courses required for the 6-12 English license. Additional Special Education courses required for full 6-12 Adaptive Special Education licensure must be taken at the graduate level.
