SB 20-21 #077

TITLE: WSGA Election Eligibility

ORIGINATOR:

SPONSOR:

STATUS: Internal Affairs – Pending, Communications Committee - Pending

WHEREAS: The Constitution and By-Laws are the governing documents of the Washburn Student Government Association, and

WHEREAS: The 'Elections' section of the By-Laws governs the WSGA election process and states the eligibility requirements to hold any office in WSGA.

WHEREAS: The qualifications for all offices are stated below:

A. Senators shall be enrolled students at Washburn University, have at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average, at least a 2.0 grade point average in the semester prior to taking office, and must maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average to continue to hold office. ... Senators must maintain a minimum enrollment of six (6) credit hours each semester of their term.

B. The Cabinet members shall be enrolled students at Washburn University, have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average, at least a 2.5 grade point average in the semester prior to taking office, and must maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average to continue to hold office. Cabinet Members must maintain a minimum enrollment of six (6) credit hours each semester of their term.

C. The President must maintain a minimum enrollment of six (6) credit hours, at Washburn University, each semester of their term. Vice President must maintain a minimum enrollment of six (6) credit hours, at Washburn University. Both President and Vice President must have at least a 3.0 cumulative grade point average, have at least a 2.75 grade point average in the semester prior to taking office, and must maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average to continue to hold office.

WHEREAS: It is the right of the WSGA Senate to interpret its by-laws.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE: The WSGA Senate changes subsection 1.C of the Election rules to mean that any person running for or elected as Vice President must maintain at least 6 credit hours each a fall and spring semester during the academic year they would serve.

SECTION TWO: This legislation shall become effective immediately after passage by the WSGA Senate.
