TITLE: Sexual Assault Awareness Month Resolution ORIGINATOR: Trautman/Hanes Administration SPONSOR: Trautman/Hanes Administration

STATUS: Campus and Community Affairs Committee - Pending

WHEREAS: The first Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign was started by the Sexual Violence Resource Center in 2001, and

WHEREAS: In 2009, President Barack Obama officially declared April as National Sexual Assault Awareness Month, also known as SAAM, and

WHEREAS: Every 68 seconds another American is sexually assaulted, and

WHEREAS: 13% of all college students experience rape or sexual assault through physical force, violence, or incapacitation, and

WHEREAS: 5.8% of students have experienced stalking since entering college, and

WHEREAS: Among undergraduate students, 26.4% of females and 6.8% of males experience rape or sexual assault through physical force, violence, or incapacitation, and

WHEREAS: Among graduate students, 9.7% of females and 2.5% of males experience rape or sexual assault through physical force, violence, or incapacitation, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION ONE: The Washburn Student Government Association stands with survivors of sexual assault and aims to continue raising awareness and prevention of sexual assault.

SECTION TWO: The Washburn Student Government Association will continue raising awareness through the "What Were You Wearing?" Display, Walk A Mile in Her Shoes event, and promoting social media posts.
