TITLE: WSGA Constitutional Amendments ORGINATOR: Parliamentarian Surritt SPONSOR: Trautman/Babcock Administration

STATUS: Constitutional and By-Law Review Committee -

WHEREAS: The Washburn Student Government Association maintains a Constitution and a set of By-Laws as its governing documents, and

WHEREAS: Those governing documents of the Washburn Student Government Association are accessible to the public so as to create an environment of transparency and accountability, and

WHEREAS: Those governing documents should be organized and easy to understand by the general public, and

WHEREAS: In their current forms, those governing documents are not so organized and this should be corrected.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE: Article I, Section 5 of the Constitution shall be amended to add "or a designated representative." at the end of the section.

SECTION TWO: The sentence stating "The Cabinet will be made up of the President, Vice President and those appointed members as defined in Chapter Three, Sections One through Sixteen of the WSGA By-laws." shall be struck from Article II, Section 2.

SECTION THREE: Article II, Section 4 shall be struck from the Constitution.

SECTION FOUR: Wording related to the WSGA President shall be struck from Article II, Section 7.

SECTION FIVE: Relocate Sections 8, 10, and 14 from Article II to new Sections in Article III.

SECTION SIX: Add new Section under Article III to say "The WSGA President shall establish Ad-Hoc Committees when deemed necessary. These Ad-Hoc Committees shall be comprised of WSGA Senators and non-senators and these student representatives shall report to the WSGA President."

SECTION SEVEN: Article III, Section 1 shall be divided up so that each of the three sentences stands as their own Section.

SECTION EIGHT: The section and subsection order and titles shall be readjusted as is appropriate.

SECTION NINE: This legislation shall become effective upon passage after the proper second reading.

WHEREAS: All Washburn students, if they are enrolled in one or more courses, must pay the \$55 Student Activity Fee, and

WHEREAS: In the spring semester of 2021, over 17% of Washburn students took less than six credit hours of classes, amounting to over 800 students and \$45,500 in student activity fee payments, and

WHEREAS: The By-Laws of the Washburn Student Government Association currently reads in the last sentence of Section 1(a) of Election Rules, "Senators must maintain a minimum enrollment of six (6) credit hours, each semester of their term," and

WHEREAS: This language in the By-Laws of the Washburn Student Government Association could unfairly limit the eligibility of Washburn students from serving on the government body that represents them.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE: The last sentence of Section 1(a) of Election Rules of the By-Laws of the Washburn Student Government Association shall read "Senators must maintain a minimum of three (3) credit hours, each semester of their term."

SECTION TWO: This legislation shall become effective upon passage.

TITLE: Acknowledging Washburn's Divestment in Fossil Fuels

ORIGINATOR: Senator Jeter

SPONSOR: Trautman/Babcock Administration STATUS: Communications Committee- Favorable

WHEREAS: According to the latest available records, as of June 30, 2020, Washburn University maintained an approximative \$180M endowment fund, and

WHEREAS: Climate change is a serious crisis facing current and future generations, and

WHEREAS: According to the Center for Biological Diversity, "Pollution from the world's currently operating oil, gas, and coal fields, if developed, would push warming well past 1.5°C, bringing dangerous extreme weather, flooded coasts, wildfires, human health catastrophes, and sweeping wildlife extinctions. In other words, our climate can't afford any new fossil fuel development", and

WHEREAS: The term "fossil fuel companies" shall refer to any company or corporation engaged in the refinement and retail sale of products such as gasoline, diesel, and natural gas, and

WHEREAS: Fossil fuel companies promote the consumption of products that worsen climate change, and

WHEREAS: According to the Union of Concerned Scientists, "Instead, they (fossil fuel companies) chose to downplay and distort the evidence of climate change, engaging in a decades-long campaign against climate action. Their tactics included everything from counterfeit science to the harassment of scientists, to manufactured uncertainty with no scientific basis. Even today, industry trade groups and associations spread disinformation on climate change, while corporate lobbyists influence politicians and regulators—all with the financial backing and support of major fossil fuel companies", and

WHEREAS: Certain fossil fuel companies engaged in campaigns of disinformation to undermine support for action on climate change, and

WHEREAS: Harvard University recently announced that it would divest its \$42 billion endowments from fossil fuel investments, and

WHEREAS: The Washburn University Alumni Association and Foundation and its investment committee have continued to address that "Environmentally responsible investing is a focus of the [investment] committee," and the investment committee plans to end its last investments in energy-based companies by the end of the year, and

WHEREAS: It is important for Washburn Student Government Association to recognize and encourage their efforts.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION ONE: The Washburn University Student Government Association acknowledges and encourages the continuing divestment of all funding toward fossil fuel companies by the Washburn Alumni Association.

SECTION TWO: The Washburn University Student Government Association requests updates on the continued divestments from the Washburn Alumni Association and Foundation.

SECTION THREE A copy of this bill shall be presented to Marshall Meek, the Washburn University Alumni Association and Foundation President.

SECTION FOUR: This legislation shall become effective upon passage.

WHEREAS: According to the study, "Prevalence and Severity of College Student Bereavement Examined in A Randomly Selected Sample", conducted by Balk, Walker, and Baker, for every two years of college, 1.7% of students can expect a parent to pass away, and

WHEREAS: 1.7% equals approximately 360,000 college students in the United States over a two-year period who are losing and grieving a parent, and

WHEREAS: Additionally, a national survey found that approximately one in nine people had lost at least one parent before the age of 20 years old, and those who lost a parent before the age of 20 years old were less likely to obtain their Bachelor's degree, and

WHEREAS: A study conducted by Purdue University involving 227 students who had experienced the death of a family member during their four years in college, half of whom had lost a parent, were found to struggle with Complicated Grief and have lower Grade Point Averages than their classmates who did not experience the death of a family member.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

SECTION ONE: The Washburn Student Government Association recognizes, stands with, and supports students who have lost a parent.

SECTION TWO: The Washburn Student Government Association will advocate for further awareness and support for students struggling with the grief of their parent(s) through social media.

SECTION THREE: This legislation shall become effective upon passage.
