Description: Proposal for Associate of Applied Science (AAS) Criminal Justice

Rationale: In order to be competitive in the market, Washburn University recently approved the offering of AAS degrees. We currently offer an AA degree in Criminal Justice. The recent KBOR changes to the general education framework have caused a significant increase in general education hours required for the AA degree and have forced us to cut the number of field-specific and technical courses we are able to require for the AA degree. For this reason, we would like to add the ability for students to choose to seek an AAS degree allowing them to meet the degree requirements while also receiving the field-specific knowledge and skills they need to be successful.
