Social Work Baccalaureate

- The baccalaureate program is accredited by the council on Social Work Education.
- Graduates of Social Work are eligible for state licensure to practice social work at the baccalaureate level.

Master of Social Work

- Specialization in clinical social work, during the second year, provides students with the theories, methods, skills, and techniques necessary for effective clinical social work practice.
