Why Study Abroad ?	Students who study overseas learn more about the world and about themselves. Exposure to foreign locales allows one to learn more about the “world out there” and, as a result, to learn more about the United States. Equally important, studying overseas is a lot of fun. Participants consistently rate their overseas experience as one of the highlights of their Washburn career.
What can I do with Study Abroad ?	Since only 1% of American undergraduates study overseas, those who do constitute an elite group. They have an advantage when competing for jobs or for admission to graduate or professional school. Foreign study also opens up employment opportunities not available to most graduates.
Degrees offered in Study Abroad ?	None, but there are minors in International Studies and International Business.
Scholarships Available?	Yes. Most students who study abroad receive scholarship assistance. Most federal and Washburn scholarships also apply to overseas programs.

PRE-LAW

Why **Pre-Law**?

There is no pre-law major. Law schools recommend you major in what interests you, but that you take as broad a curriculum as you possibly can. Course selection should be done in conjunction with a pre-law advisor who should guide course selection toward LSAT preparation, preparation for law school and breadth of curriculum exposure. Assuming a broad and challenging curriculum and extensive preparation for the LSAT, students should be competitive for admission to law school.

What can I do with **Pre-Law**?

Students who prepare for law school have several options. First, they may gain admission to law school or other graduate programs. Second, because they should have a broad curriculum exposure (including excellent communication skills), pre-law students should be competitive for employment with public, private, or non-profit employers.

Degrees offered in **Pre-Law**?

No degree offered. Any degree or any major within any degree program is appropriate for law school as long as elective credits are utilized to broaden and not to narrow the educational experience.

ART HISTORY

Why major in Art History ?	The study of art history is similar to the study of history, both try to understand the diversity as well as commonalities of human thought, values, and struggles from prehistoric times to today. The difference between art history and history is that art history examines works of art as primary historical evidence as opposed to textual documents. The study of art history is for everyone who is intrigued by visual arts, including architecture, and by a keen interest in understanding history and different cultures. It is an excellent preparation for anyone who will work in any field related to the humanities, and the study of art history will enrich one's life no matter what you do.
What can I do with a major in Art History ?	Art history majors can find a variety of jobs in art museums, such as curators of collections, curators of education, museum administration. Art history majors can follow a library career track, as art librarians at colleges or universities, or as slide librarians at museums or art departments; can also study law and specialize in legal issues concerning all aspects of art. Art history majors can pursue a career in public art administration, at the local, state and federal levels, and they can become independent scholars/curators or pursue a university career in art history.

The B.S. degree prepares students for employment in the chemical and biochemical industry and/or for graduate study in chemistry and geochemistry. What can I do with a major in **Chemistry**?

Within the city and state, chemistry graduates are employed in government and private laboratories such as KBI, KDHE, and M.D. Chemical. Throughout the nation, employment opportunities are found in the chemical and pharmaceutical industries. Chemistry graduates also find careers in teaching, writing law, and as technical librarians. A significant number of our students attend either professional schools or graduate schools to study chemistry and biochemistry upon graduation from Washburn.

Why major in Computer Information Sciences ?	The field of Computer Information Sciences is filled with exciting opportunities for employment in today's technological society. The Bureau of Labor Statistics indicates the need for 750,000 new Information Technology (IT) professionals in the next 3 to 10 years, and this does not include the 30% of IT professional that will reach retirement age in the next 5 to 10 years. New graduates will be needed to fill these positions.

Upon graduation it is expected our graduates will: 1) enter the IT field in a programmer/analyst position with a career path to a managerial position or 2) enter an MIS/MBA graduate program. Outstanding graduates will start and manage companies.

Why major in Respiratory Therapy ?	The U.S. Department of Labor Statistics shows the demand for Respiratory Therapists is expected to grow faster than average and to increase by 36% through 2012. Respiratory Therapists are a vital member of the health care team in the areas of preventative care, critical care, emergency care, education, and management. As a Respiratory Therapist you will not only have the sense of pride in a profession, but a median starting salary of about \$42,930 a year in 2003.
What can I do with a major in Respiratory Therapy ?	Respiratory Therapists work with patients in the critical care unit, ER, Neonatal unit, outpatient clinics, critical transport, physician clinics and home care. Respiratory Therapists will not only be able to choose where they want to work, but also have the option for management or education of patients or future RTs.

The majority of federal law enforcement and correction agencies, and many state and local agencies now require a baccalaureate degree for entry level positions. Most state and local criminal justice agencies require a degree for promotion to higher ranks. Those agencies that do not require a degree for entry-level positions, often start the degree-holder at a higher salary. Jobs available to those who major in criminal justice include: FBI, DEA, Secret Service, Postal Inspection Service, Federal Probation, Highway Patrol, City and County Police.
