**Definitions:**

Graduated within 150% of normal time: Students who completed their program within 150% of the normal (or expected) time for completion.

Normal time: The amount of time necessary for a student to complete all requirements for a degree or certificate according to the institution's catalog. This is typically 4 years for a bachelor's degree in a standard term-based institution.

Graduation rate: The rate is calculated as the total number of completers within 150% of normal time divided by the revised adjusted cohort.

Retention Rate: The percentage of students who persist in their educational program from one Fall term to the next. This rate reflects the percentage of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students who were enrolled in the previous fall and are again enrolled in the current fall.

### Washburn University Graduation Rate

The Graduation Rate measures the percentage of first-time, full-time degree-seeking students who complete a degree within six years (150% of the normal time). It serves as a key indicator of student success and institutional effectiveness in helping students complete their education.



 Graduation rate: The rate is calculated as the total number of completers within 150% of normal time divided by the revised adjusted cohort.

### Washburn University Retention Rate

Retention Rate measures the percentage of students who persist in their educational program from one Fall term to the next. This rate reflects the percentage of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students who were enrolled in the previous fall and are again enrolled in the current fall. This metric is a key indicator of student success and institutional effectiveness, providing valuable insights into how well an institution supports students in continuing or completing their educational goals.


