STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

There are several ways to pay for a college education. One important way it to utilize free money available from the federal government. To apply for this free aid, students must submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

According to NCES, financial aid is received by 85.5% of all students pursuing higher education including college, university, or vocational school.

Current high school seniors should request a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID by mid-October for both the student and their parent/guardian.

8 Steps to Apply for Federal Student Aid:

- 1. Have Documentation Available (you can find what's needed <u>here</u>)
- 2. Create a Federal Student Aid Account and ID
- 3. Complete the Online FAFSA
- 4. List Codes of Colleges and Universities the student is applying to
- 5. Review, Sign, and Submit the FAFSA application
- 6. Receive the Student Aid Report (SAR)
- 7. Provide additional documentation as necessary
- 8. Receive, Review, and Accept Financial Aid Offers
