

The FAFSA is officially open which means it is time to submit a form.

Any student, regardless of income, who wants to be considered for federal, state, and school financial aid programs should be submitting a FAFSA form.

This includes grants, scholarships, work-study funds, and loans.

Colleges and career schools use the FAFSA form to determine how much financial aid you're eligible to receive.

2024 was a year of success and growth opportunities for Upward Bound (UB)

A Growing Community:

- 5 new Peer Mentors/Tutors
- 17 new UB members
- 1 new UB Administrative Specialist

A Few Program Accomplishments:

- 87.5% post secondary enrollment.

Thank you to all UB parents, UB students, THS faculty and staff members, and Washburn University staff members for the continuous support!



⇒ Summer Academy is an academic and college readiness 6-week long residential camp for upcoming 9th-12th graders in the Upward Bound program.

When is Summer Academy?

⇒ Monday June 2nd, 2025 through Friday July 11th, 2025 (6 weeks)

What to expect during Summer Academy?

⇒ Summer Academy's purpose is to help students prepare for the upcoming school year, to provide a preview of what it is like to live on a college campus, and to practice success skills by partaking in academic classes (English Composition, English Literature, Math, Spanish Language, and Laboratory Science). Students will also be exposed to financial literacy workshops, teambuilding activities, cultural enrichment field trips, campus tours, and so much more!

Summer Bridge 2025

What is Summer Bridge?

⇒ Summer Bridge is a 6 week long residential program to help current UB Class of 2025 seniors transition from high school to college by providing academic and social support. Students selected to participate is the Summer Bridge will also earn up to 6 FREE transferable college credit hours from Washburn University.

When is Summer Bridge?

⇒ Monday June 2nd, 2025 through Friday July 11th, 2025 (6 weeks)

What is the difference between Summer Academy and Summer Bridge?

⇒ Summer Academy is only for upcoming 9th-12th graders in high school while Summer Bridge is for graduating seniors who will be attending college during the upcoming Fall semester. Summer Bridge also offers the opportunity to earn up to 6 college credit hours while Summer Academy does not.

What to expect during Summer Bridge?

⇒ Summer Bridge's purpose is to help prospective college students smoothly transition from high school to university. Students enroll in up to 2 college courses (6 credit hours) and participate in various activities designed to prepare them for their first semester in college.





STRATECIES FOR SCHOLARSHIP

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A scholarship essay is an essay that students submit with their scholarship applications.

Your scholarship essay will help you set yourself apart from other applicants who may share similar scores and extracurricular activities

Below are strategies you can use to write a phenomenal scholarship essay.

KNOW THE P PURPOSE



What is the reader trying to learn?

SHARE AN NECDOTE



Share an anecdote that fits this prompt.

SHOW G CROWTH



What did you learn? What did you overcome?

USE EMOTIVE LANCUACE



Write a sentence for your essay using a Emotive or Descriptive Language.

START



Brainstorm and write a hook for your essay. Leave the reader wanting more.



STRATECIES FOR **SCHOLARSHIP**

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The National Scholarship Providers Association reports that an estimated \$100 million in scholarship money goes unawarded each year! Make sure you're researching and applying to every scholarship for which you qualify.

Emotive Language is the deliberate use of words and phrases to evoke an emotional response. It can be either positive or negative. Try:

- Using words that elicit emotion
 - A sense of nervousness swept over my entire body. Doubt crept into my mind, my stomach felt as if it was twisting into a knot, and my legs trembled uncontrollably as I walked to the podium to deliver my speech.
- - To my left, a young teenage girl smacked on her gum and shuffled the pages of her magazine inconsiderately. To my right, an older gentleman clacked on his keyboard raucously. Would I ever get this essay done?
- aling to the reader's sense
 - The aroma of my grandmother's sugar cookies filled the air. I eagerly bit into the warm treat, and a burst of flavor overtook me. I could eat a dozen of these!

When will the 2025-2026 FAFSA be available?

The U.S. Department of Education is currently testing the upcoming FAFSA to work out more of the issues experienced last year before opening to the general public. **The 2025-2026 FAFSA is open now!** Complete yours at FAFSA® Application | Federal Student Aid

What if I need help completing my FAFSA?

Washburn University will offer drop-in FAFSA completion assistance in the Plass Computer Lab between 4 - 6 p.m. on the following dates:

- February 12
- February 18
- February 27

You can also contact the Financial Aid Office to schedule a one-on-one appointment during regular business hours.

The U.S. Department of Education is aware that there continue to be ongoing issues with the FAFSA form that may carry over to 2025-2026. A list of known issues and their workarounds are available online.

What happens after I complete my FAFSA?

If you included the Federal School Code for either Washburn University (001949) or Washburn Tech (010689), the financial aid office should receive your application data within 3-5 business days after your FAFSA is fully submitted. Once received, you will be contacted if we need additional information from you to fully process your application to create a financial aid offer. You will be contacted again once your financial aid offer is available.

While waiting for your financial aid offer, you should also review and apply for other types of financial aid available.
