Fast Track Plan

Our Fast Track Plan for a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice enables focused students to complete the last year of their undergraduate degree while taking twelve hours of gradate course work. Students will complete approximately 90 hours toward their undergraduate degree before entering the Masters of Criminal Justice program in their last year of the BCJ program. Students should plan to take six hours of Master's courses in each the fall and spring semesters of their senior year, which will count toward both their master's degree requirements and bachelor's criminal justice elective courses, in addition to any outstanding undergraduate work to be completed.
