Scholarship Facts

The Minority Women in STEM Scholarship is a prestigious scholarship awarded by the Washburn University College of Arts and Sciences to incoming high school students who have been successful in high school and have an interest in studying Computer Information Science or Pre-Engineering. It provides \$4,000 per year for up to four years at Washburn. Four scholarships are available.

Who Is Eligible:

Prospective Washburn students with academic promise and have expressed an interest in studying:

- Pre-Engineering*
- Computer Information Science

- Demonstration of high school success

A prospective student is defined as a high school senior who has been admitted to Washburn University. To remain eligible the student is required to be a full-time student at Washburn University in academic good standing in the programs listed above.

*Washburn University's pre-engineering program combines Washburn's small class sizes, working with expert faculty from day one, and flexibility to be involved on campus in a wide array of activities with the ability to earn an engineering degree from a larger institution. Through cooperative agreements with four-year engineering institutions, Washburn students can choose to either transfer to complete the requirements for their Bachelor of Science degree, or participate in a 3 + 2 program that allows students to also pursue an additional degree in physics, chemistry, or math. Current university partners for the 3 + 2 program include University of Kansas, Kansas State University, and the University of Missouri – Kansas City. To earn degrees from both institutions, regular requirements for each degree must be fulfilled. Courses will be selected, as much as possible, to simultaneously fulfill degree requirements from both universities.
