Curriculum and Instruction with Emphasis in Educational Technology

Core Courses: The following 12 semester hours are required:

- ED 672 Issues in American Education (3 hrs)
ED 660 Advanced Education Psychology (3 hrs)
ED 665 Introduction to Educational Research (3 hrs)
ED 668 Curriculum Development and Evaluation (3 hrs)

Area of Concentration: A minimum of 24 semester hours from the courses below including the two required courses and 18 hours of electives. Substitutions must be approved by the Graduate Program Advisor, the department's Graduate Program Committee, and the Chair of the Education Department.

Required Courses:

- ED 685 Issues in Educational Technology (3 hrs)
ED 680 Integrating Educational Technology in Curriculum (3 hrs)
* ED 680 requires a clinical/field experience that allows students to apply their skills and knowledge in a school or classroom setting.

Electives: Elective courses are chosen and approved in cooperation with the program advisor.
