Overall Recommendations

Based on the findings, students are meeting, and in some cases exceeding, established target goals. The recommendation is to continue to monitor these measures and to continue collecting data annually. In terms of the larger report, it seems that we can improve in two areas: 1) find new ways to reach out to external stakeholders, and 2) find more opportunities to engage with the University about our assessment practices.

Overall Reflection

Overall, this assessment cycle demonstrates that our students are prepared to express themselves in their target language. All students evaluated are meeting or exceeding the target threshold. We will continue to monitor course grades and portfolio grades (the two measures used in this report) to ensure that students



continue gaining knowledge and fluency in their chosen language.

Faculty Collaboration

This type of data is shared during the annual department retreat, which is a time for our department to discuss long-term goals, projects, and other items that are monitored annually. Since all students have met the minimum thresholds of both measures this year, the data suggests that faculty should continue to follow current approaches and update as needed. If something needs to be corrected or addressed, this annual retreat would be the first step in discussing such changes.

Communication & Collaboration with Students

PSLO's are shared with students by placing them on syllabi. Of course, the measure that involves "course grades" is not included in any way, but all majors are aware that they must have a portfolio (the 2nd measure) by the time that they graduate.

Communication & Collaboration with External Stakeholders

This is an area that we continue to discuss as a department. This information is generally included on our departmental website, but as of right now there is no specific plan to reach out and regularly share this information with external stakeholders (only faculty and students, and the assessment committee). However, the information is available to everyone through the departmental website should they be interested. More work is needed in this area.

Communication & Collaboration with University

Our annual assessment reports are submitted each year through Task Stream, but more work is needed in terms of communication and collaboration with the University. Our assessment liaison reviews feedback from the Assessment Committee each year and takes all recommendations under consideration, in consultation with departmental faculty.
