# **Assessment Findings**

#### **Program Assessment Accomplishments**

Overall, there have not been significant changes since our last assessment cycle. We have found, as a department, that

students are meeting the measures we have put in place. That being said, we have had significant changes in the makeup

of our faculty since our last official report. However, those changes appear to have no significant impact on the assessment outcomes. Students are meeting the markers we have set in place. I do recommend that the department as a

whole meet in the fall semester to discuss assessment in general.

#### **BA - Political Science Outcome Set**

#### Outcome: Basic knowledge of political institutions and processes

Demonstrate a basic knowledge of the political institutions and political processes of the governments of the United States.

**▼ Measure:** Political Institutions and Processes

Course level Direct - Exam

Details/Description: PO106, PO107 both incorporate exams to measure

how well students understand basic knowledge of

political institutions.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students are expected to pass this exam

upon exiting these courses.

Findings for Political Institutions and Processes

Summary of Findings: We have met the standards set.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Exceeded

Recommendations: We should continue to monitor results to

ensure we are consistently hitting the 70%

mark.

Reflections/Notes: Moving forward, the department should

continue discussions about whether quizzes are the best way to assess our students.

Conversations about test anxiety, etc. are important to have considering not all

students do well one one

type of assessment. For example, some students may do better with a written test as

opposed to a multiple choice exam.

# PSLO 2

## Outcome: Basic knowledge of international political issues

Demonstrate a basic knowledge of international political issues, international organizations, and the world political economy.

▼ **Measure:** International Politics Assessment

Course level Direct - Exam

Details/Description: Students will complete a quiz in PO225 that will be

administered at the start and finish of the course. The goal of the quiz is to test student retention of

some of the key aspects of this course.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students are expected to successfully pass

this quiz upon exiting the course.

Findings for International Politics Assessment

Summary of Findings: Students are successfully passing the post-

test at a rate of 70% or higher.

Results : Acceptable Target Achievement: Exceeded

Recommendations: Continue to think about other potential ways

to assess this particular item. The

department should brainstorm and discuss if this is truly the best measure. That being said, the measure seems effective and does not

necessarily need to change.

# Outcome: Basic knowledge of other national governing systems

Demonstrate a basic knowledge of other national governing systems, and other national and regional group perspectives of political power and political economy through the application of the techniques of comparative politics.

▼ Measure: Comparative Politics Assessment

Course level Direct - Exam

Details/Description: Students will take a "PO 235 Basic Facts Quiz"

during the first and last weeks of class. The goal of the quiz is to test students' retention of some of the key aspects of the course, as it pertains to other national governments and other main goals of the

course.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students are expected to be able to

successfully complete this quiz.

Findings for Comparative Politics Assessment

Summary of Findings: Students are successfully passing the end of

semester quiz regarding basic knowledge of

other national governing systems.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Exceeded

Recommendations: Consider whether a quiz is the best way to

measure this for all students. Is there another type of student archive that might give us more information about to what degree of understanding about other governments our

students really have.

Reflections/Notes: While I do recommend some thought be

given to this particular assessment tool, that does not necessarily mean it is not a good measure. It simply means it is worth a conversation to continue our thoughts on

how to assess this.

# PSLO 5

#### Outcome: Basic knowledge of principles and problems of complex organizations

Demonstrate a basic knowledge of the principles and problems of complex organizations and processes associated with public and civil society administration.

▼ Measure: American Government Focus

Course level Direct - Exam

Details/Description: Students in PO 106 and 107 will complete a basic

knowledge quiz which will cover material specific to these courses. In this quiz, students will be asked to display their knowledge the principles and

problems of complex organizations and processes

associated with public and civil society

administration.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students are expected to pass this quiz.

## Findings for American Government Focus

Summary of Findings: Students are meeting this marker

successfully. However, there seems to be some inconsistencies with the rate of success

across classes.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Met

Recommendations: I am suggesting a different type of

assessment be used to really get at this particular topic. A student archive of some type would give us a more in-depth look at how much students are really digesting this

type of information.

Reflections/Notes: If the department does not agree with my

recommendation, we should at least

consider adding additional questions to the quizzes that would give us more information

about this item.

**▼ Measure:** International Government Focus

Course level Direct - Exam

Details/Description: Students enrolled in PO 235 and PO 225 will take

pre and post quizzes to assess how much they have learned about the principles and problems of complex organizations and processes associated with public and civil society administration.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students enrolled in these courses are

expected to successfully pass these quizzes.

Findings for International Government Focus

Summary of Findings: We are seeing that students are successfully

meeting the goal we have set for this

measurement tool.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Met

Recommendations: I recommend the faculty member

responsible for administering this measure review the questions to make sure they are still matching with lectures and readings.

Much of this information may have changed over time, and it would be good to make sure the questions are still accurately reflecting

the material presented in class.

Details/Description: Students in PO 106 are expected to complete an

assignment in which they design polling questions, ask people their questions, and assess the data the

receive.

Acceptable Target: 75% of students are expected to successfully

complete this task.

Findings for American Government Focus

Summary of Findings: Students overwhelmingly do well on this

particular task. Students consistently show enthusiasm and interest for this particular

task.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Exceeded

Recommendations: The department should discuss if this

particular measure could be used in other

courses that discuss this topic.

# Outcome: Ability to understand the policy making process

Details/Description: Students will complete a guiz in this course

designed to test general knowledge of concepts like

the policy making process.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students are expected to successfully pass

this quiz.

### Findings for American Government Focus

Summary of Findings: Students in 106 complete a quiz that includes

information about the policy making process. To date, students are meeting the

expectations.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Met

Recommendations: I think this would be better assessed using a

student archive as opposed to quiz questions. The quiz does not ask enough questions over this topic to really gauge how much students

are retaining about this topic.

Reflections/Notes: I would like to see an archive used as the

assessment for this measure moving

forward.

**▼ Measure:** American Government Focus

Course level Direct - Student Artifact

Details/Description: Students will engage in a series of in-class activities

designed to help them practically apply the theoretical policy concepts taught in lecture and

readings.

Acceptable Target: 75% of students are expected to engage in, and

complete, these in-class activities.

Findings for American Government Focus

Summary of Findings: Students perform very well on these tasks.

Overall, this seems to provide a more accurate snapshot of student performance on this topic as opposed to quiz questions.

Results : Acceptable Target Achievement: Exceeded

Recommendations: I recommend keeping this tool as opposed to

going back to a quiz.

Course level Direct - Exam

Details/Description: Students are introduced to the concepts of

international law in PO225. As such, they will be asked questions in a pre- and post-test regarding

this topic.

Acceptable Target: 70% of students are expected to successfully pass

the post-test quiz.

Findings for International Government Focus

Summary of Findings: Students appear to do a good job of retaining

the information presented in this portion of the course, as evidenced by their ability to accurately recall information on the quiz.

Results: Acceptable Target Achievement: Met

Recommendations: I do not see a need for changes to this

measure at this time.

#### **Overall Recommendations**

I would like to implement a more streamlined way for faculty members to report on their assessment measures. There

needs to be a more efficient way for me to gather evidence of success or evidence that we need to make improvements.

That should be my personal focus moving forward.

#### **Overall Reflection**

My focus for the next academic year will be to fine-tune how we handle our assessment. I plan on reviewing in depth all

assessment tools and will create a way for faculty members to effectively and efficiently report the results of their course assessments.

We have had significant losses in our department with the passing of Dr. Cann and Clark Duffy. Additionally, we no longer have our lecturer and will be conducting a search for the replacement. When that happens, I will need to re-evaluate some of our Public Admin courses.

#### **Faculty Collaboration**

We need to establish a regular meeting time (ideally at least once per semester) to brainstorm several things:

- 1. We need to streamline how I get information regarding student performance on assessment tools.
- 2. If the assessment tools we currently use are really the best way to get at what we are trying to measure.
