# Natural Science Division (NSD) Meeting Minutes <br> Friday, October 21, 2022 

I. Meeting called to order at 2:02 pm by Division Chair Seid Adem.
II. Minutes of the previous NSD meeting (09/09/2022) were approved as circulated.
III. Committee Reports
A. Advisory enrollment management committee (tentative):
a. The new director of enrollment, Alan Bearman, will utilize an advisory committee (from the faculty handbook) for enrollment management instead of forming a new committee. This topic will be clarified in the upcoming Faculty Senate meeting.
IV. Old Business - none.
V. Discussions -
A. Program Change Form: Eliminate the 84-credit hour rule for Bachelor of Education Degrees and the Bachelor of Integrated Studies Degree. The discussion was led by Kelly Erby on the proposal to remove the requirement of the CAS credits for Bachelor of Education and the Bachelor of Integrated Studies
a. Due to the move of the Education Department from CAS to the School of Applied Studies, it is difficult for students to complete the said requirement without going over the 120 -credit.
b. Social Science Division wanted the changes to be separated, and they did not support the change for BIS.
c. Can we still require a minimum number of credits? Requiring a minimum 72 CAS credits for B.Ed. Majority of NSD support this requirement.
d. NSD supports the separation of the changes to the two programs.
e. Since BIS is a CAS degree, there should be a minimum number of hours in CAS.
f. So far, BIS is not an actively advertised program but used as a parachute program; yet the number of students keeps increasing.
g. More data and context on BIS will help our discussion.
B. Introduction of the Great-TEXTS certificate program. The division discussed the new program introduced by Kelly Erby.
a. Sponsored by an engineer who wished he had taken more humanity courses during his undergrad and thought humanity courses can complement his engineer degree better.
b. Marketed directly to the natural science students (non-humanity majors) and firstgen students. Students will get tuition for the program waived and textbooks for free.
c. Right now, only 15 students can be admitted into the program due to funding.

We are removing the sentence "No more than five hours of credit will be awarded for MA 141 and/or MA 151". The Math Department occasionally has students who take MA 141 Applied Calculus for 3 credits and then change their major to one that requires MA 151 Calculus \& Analytic Geometry for 5 credits. Historically the Math Department has created a 2 credit MA 299 course for these students. In the MA 299 course, the student attends and is responsible for all homework and exams in the 5 credit MA 151, but only receives 2 credits. This can be a burden to students who want to enroll in 15 credits, but cannot keep up with 18 credits of workload. We want to remove this limit of 5 hours of credit as we believe this will be beneficial to some students. We will also still allow students with MA 141 credit the option of taking a 2 credit MA 299 course if they prefer that option.

We are also correcting a small typo by changing "student" to "students".

This can be a burden to students who want to enroll in 15 credits, but cannot keep up with 18 credits of workload. We want to remove this limit of 5 hours of credit as we believe this will be beneficial to some students. We will also still allow students with MA 141 credit the option of taking a 2 credit MA 299 course if they prefer. Also, the course description for MA 141 says that it is not open to students with credit in MA 151 so there is no concern over a student completing MA 151 and then enrolling in MA 141.

These points and questions are in response to the discussion item entitled, "Eliminating the 84 semester hours of credit in courses that are offered in the CAS as a requirement for Bachelor of Education (BEd) degrees and the Bachelor of Integrated Studies (BIS) degree." Questions about program changes also emerge in the following statements.

Point 1: "In terms of the discussion item regarding the CAS hour requirements for B.Ed. and BIS students, I was wondering if someone (maybe [name redacted]?) can help explain why BIS students should be exempt from this specifically. It makes obvious sense given Education leaving CAS for B.Ed. degrees to no longer require 84 hours, but aside from "greater flexibility," I'm not sure I see the rationale for BIS students. The BIS is a degree conferred by CAS, so I think I need some clearer reasoning here before we alter this expectation. Indeed, to me, it seems like these two program/degree changes should be split. Yes, they both have to do with the 84 CAS hour requirement, but the reasoning behind eliminating the requirement is different for each area. This is just my two cents, and I know we're not voting on it here. But I do think that these questions should be able to be answered as such changes head toward committees that will be voting on them."

Response A to Point 1: "We have actually discussed this issue with the BIS (Bachelor of Integrated Studies) before... pre-pandemic. It should have gone up for final vote when all of the others did, but it was accidentally removed from the final draft. I am honestly trying to correct that mistake. The 99 rule hurts many of my students. They come to the major from the other schools, often with degree almost in hand, only to find they still have X number of CAS credits. Many of them have credits way above and beyond the 120 by this point and are a half-step away from choosing to drop out entirely. As Modern Languages and Philosophy discussed the last time this came up, this rule places a burden on students and hinders their graduation. This is a similar situation with the BIS. I would be happy to discuss the BIS further if you need more information."

Response B to Point 1: "I think I agree with [name redacted] here about the possible split and/or discussion of the two related CAS-hours issues."

Response C to Point 1: "We have been working on that in our office just in case. NSD asked for some data that we are waiting to hear about regarding BIS students and number of credits. I will have an update once I have more information."

Response D to Point 1: "I see the logic, and this makes sense to me, so I have no objections."

Point 2: "Thanks for the discussion, [names redacted]. I could see that since BIS is interdisciplinary, even though it's housed in CAS, it might not make sense to have a specific CAS requirement. However, I think my follow-up questions would be: (a) What other programs in CAS do not have the 84-credit CAS requirement? (b) If the BIS is the only one, what would be the continued rationale for the BIS to remain in CAS? [To be clear, I'm not suggesting BIS should move or implying that it isn't a CAS degree (because I think it clearly makes sense for it to be positioned as a CAS degree), but perceptually, if it was the only degree within CAS that didn't require CAS credits, I would wonder how CAS would justify the program's current college/school
"home." I suspect the Deans have already discussed this and have the rationale established, but I'm curious nonetheless.]"

Response to Point 2: "To be clear, right now the BIS still has 99 hours required within CAS. Also, the need for this change is going to become more important now that Ed is not in CAS. Also, Integrated Studies is unique in that it does not have the language requirement. BIS HOME - You ask an interesting question that we had been trying to address before all of the leadership changes. Currently, BIS students are required to include CAS courses as part of their designed major. There are also a few versions of Integrated Studies - Liberal Arts, Webtech, and Admin CN - that are completely, or mostly built, within CAS as a pre-design. It is the true Integrated Studies student that has issues with the additional CAS credits. Prior to all of the changes, there had been some interesting discussion about possible solutions, but I have no idea when I can get it back on the VPAA agenda... I am guessing once General Education is a little less unknown."

Response to this Response: "Thank you for the clarification, [name redacted]. I would be in favor of decreasing the required hours to 84 to match other degrees in CAS, but not of eliminating the requirement altogether. Again, I know this isn't a vote, but that's my two cents. This might be a better in-person discussion topic for another meeting? Also, I'm still in favor of splitting the "action item" regarding the CAS hours (for whatever body will have to approve it) since the two degree areas are attempting to remove or decrease the CAS hours for very different reasons."

Point 3: "I have a couple of questions to clarify some things about the program changes. These are probably nitpicks, but that's what shared governance is intended to do, right? Communications major change: is there a reason that CN 303 is listed under electives, but not CN 304 or CN 305? Also: does CN 303 include some of both qual and quant methods? For the FR/SP minor, the change appears to be that now students can include FR/SP 102 as part of their 18 hours. What's the reason for the change? The only reasoning given is that more students are expected to minor in French? What's the basis for that expectation? (I'm not challenging the changes-I just want to ask the kinds of questions that might come up at higher levels in the governance path.)"

Response A to Point 3: "To your CN 303 question, [name redacted]: We only have "core" and "elective" classes in our major. When we reactivated CN 303 last year, Banner automatically listed it under electives because, until this curriculum change becomes official, it can't be listed where we want it (under the core method course option to go with CN 304 and CN 305). And yes, it will approach methodology from a mixedmethods/triangulation approach rather than a purely qualitative or quantitative one."

Response B to Point 3: "In reply to [name redacted] question regarding FR and SP minor changes: FR102 and SP102 used to be part of the major and minor programs back in the day. For some reason, we decided to drop those courses years ago and begin our programs at the intermediate level. That proved to be a bad decision and we began to lose minors and majors. Most other programs have a beginning class (or more) as part of their programs, and we have heard from some students that after taking FR or SP102 for their BA Foreign Language requirement, and then the intermediate language sequence (201 and 202) for their general education in Humanities, they would like to continue with the language. Currently, they have 6 credits towards the minor (since 102 does not count), and would need 12 more at least. By adding 102 to the minor, they will have 10 credits, with only 8 more needed. Believe it or not, students think that changes the game, and they would be
interesting in completing those 8 hours and earning a minor. I hope this helps. Let me know."
