





Analysis and Reporting Calendar

Data are collected and analyzed for each PSLO (1-8) every semester. For this report, 2 assignments are selected to report for each PSLO.

Stakeholder Involvement

Assessment committee meets at least three times per semester with representatives from both undergraduate and graduate faculty. Faculty members are involved in administering ATI exams at all 4 levels of the program. Faculty members serve as portfolio advisors one semester per year and assist in grading using a grading rubric. The assessment committee has one student representative. Courses with multiple faculty meet weekly/monthly as needed to discuss student performance using real-time didactic (and when appropriate clinical evaluations) grades

Faculty who teach courses that are taught at a specific level (e.g. Level 1 courses) meet twice a semester (or more often during major curricular change phases) to discuss student performance, student workload, course and level outcomes (when appropriate)

The Director & Associate Dean of the SON are informed by course/level coordinators/faculty of possible at-risk students in all upper-division nursing courses. A process improvement plan is discussed between the Associate Dean and the faculty with direct involvement with the atrisk students.

Chair of the SON Assessment Committee continues to collect end-of-semester portfolio data that is shared with Assessment Committee members.

End-of-semester meetings are held for all faculty to comment/plan strategies to improve student learning on the course/level/ and end of program outcomes. Minutes are kept of the end-ofsemester meetings for purposes of recording proposed changes needed for the BSN (prelicensure program).

Annual faculty meetings held in August allow the Chairperson of the SON Assessment Committee to inform all SON faculty of the status of our performance metrics, and goals of the SON Assessment Committee for refining the assessment process.

The Dean of the SON meets monthly with the VPAA to discuss any concerns regarding SON performance metrics.
