Overall Recommendations

Integrated Studies is getting ready for a major overhaul in program requirements which will transform it into more of a general studies major. Assessment will need to address this change when it occurs.

Overall Reflection

Currently, the IS students are meeting or exceeding expectations for the degree. As we continue to develop this program and build in a more general studies component, it will be important to track the more specific IS students with the more generalized General Studies students. This might take a few years to have an adequate

data set and is dependent on university approval.

Faculty Collaboration

Faculty that assist in mentoring student Capstone projects meet with the BIS director to discuss student learning and expectations.

Other than the Capstone Prep/Capstone courses, there are no additional faculty for this major.

Communication & Collaboration with Students

In order to close the feedback loop, I will need to look into posting assessment results on the web. There is not a department, and students frequently join the degree program very late in their education.

It might also be helpful to find a way to track alumni data.

Communication & Collaboration with External Stakeholders

In order to examine best practices for an interdisciplinary degree, all KBOR four year institutions were analyzed to see what offerings they had for a more general program and what the requirements were for that program.

Communication & Collaboration with University

There is a BIS CAS faculty committee that met within the last two years to discuss assessment data and potential changes to the degree.

The Director has attended CTEL events to aid in academic planning (e.g. Welcome to Academic Planning Next Generation, etc.), met with the Assessment director both in the fall and spring, attended a Zoom meeting for assessment with assessment, met with the Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs, and the College Dean regarding assessment for Integrated Studies and the future of the program.

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
