A minimum of 6 hours will be at the upper-division level. Students must have a grade of "C" or better in each course. A minimum of six hours used to meet the certificate requirements must be earned in residence at Washburn University. Students may request alternate coursework be accepted toward the minor. Students should make these requests prior to completing coursework.
