Judging

- 1. Each event will be judged on the criteria listed in the Homecoming Registration Packet. All events will be scored by judges.
- 2. Judges will be given a range of points that can be allotted for each event. Points will then be tallied and put in rank order to determine the winner.
- 3. Points will be awarded, and plaques presented to the 1st place winners as stated in the packet.
- 4. The organization with the highest number of points at the end of Homecoming Week will be awarded the Grand Championship trophy in each fraternity and sorority categories.
- 5. Judges will be solicited through the Homecoming Judges Sub-committee.
- 6. Judges will be comprised of students, faculty, staff, and/or alumni of Washburn.
- 7. Decisions by the judges are final. There will be no appeals.
- 8. After the judging has been completed for an event approaching judges will not be allowed.
- 9. Concerns, suggestions, and questions may be addressed, in writing, to the Homecoming Judges Sub-committee and delivered to the Office of Student Life.

<u>Ichabods of Honor</u> Nomination of Candidates & Selection

Nominating Candidates:

- 1. Registered student organizations may nominate two candidates. Only one can be from their designated organization. All nominees must be a part of a registered student organization.
- 2. Each candidate must complete the nomination form and submit it to the Ichabods of Honor committee.
- 3. The committee will verify all information including candidate's cumulative grade point average, number of credit hours earned, and student conduct status.
- 4. Candidates must currently be a full-time student at Washburn University.

Candidate Requirements:

- 1. Must be nominated by a Washburn University registered student organization, with an accurate current roster.
- 2. Must be a student in good standing, enrolled at Washburn, and have earned a minimum of 72 credit hours. A minimum of 24 hours must be from Washburn.
- 3. Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.85 or above.
- 4. Must complete a nomination form and allow university personnel to verify all information including grades, credit hours, conduct status, and overall university status. A resume is required when submitting the nomination form.
- 5. Must be willing to allow your picture and biographical information to be used for the promotion of the Ichabods of Honor during homecoming activities.
- 6. Must participate in a personal interview with a committee of judges.
- 7. Must participate in homecoming activities such as Bod Bash, Yell Like Hell, Parade, and the half-time ceremony of the football game. May also be asked to participate in other homecoming and Alumni activities throughout the week.
- 8. Candidates may not be nominated by more than one student organization.

Selection of Ichabods of Honor:

- 1. A committee of judges will review candidate materials. The candidate materials will be 25% of the final decision.
- 2. A committee of judges will interview all candidates and rate them based on established guidelines. The interview will consist of 25% of the final Ichabods of Honor decision.
- 3. The top-rated candidates will be chosen as finalists.
- 4. Only finalists may be voted as Homecoming Ichabods of Honor.
- 5. The Ichabods of Honor (3 candidates) will be selected by a combination of the scores received through the resume, interview, and voting process (50% of the final decision).
- 6. Students may vote for three Ichabods of Honor candidates and may only vote once.
- 7. Nominees will be introduced, and the Homecoming Ichabods of Honor finalists will be announced at the Bod Bash.
- 8. The Ichabod of Honor, 1st runner up and 2nd runner up will be announced during halftime of the football game.
- 9. In the event of a tie, the Ichabod of Honor will be chosen based on student body vote score.

Campaigning:

- 1. Candidates, nominating organizations, etc. cannot put any monetary resources into campaigning. However, acceptable forms of advertising for candidates include social media posts, chalking, word of mouth, etc.
- 2. Pictures and biographical information about each finalist, as well as voting information, will be posted in prominent places on campus and in university publications to promote interest in homecoming.

Ichabods of Honor Nominations are due September 9, 2025, at 5:00pm.

<u>Description:</u> This year, in addition to Top Hats, office decor, and the other Homecoming competitions, there will be a competitive canned food drive! Donations can include non-perishable food items,

money, hygiene items, or some school supplies (listed below). All proceeds will be included in

the annual Can Emporia competition total and given to Bods Feeding Bods.

Requirements: Donation Regulations and Drop-Off Locations

<u>1.</u> <u>Labeling Physical Donations:</u> Upon signing up to participate in the food drive competition, you will be assigned a tag color and letter code (pick-up in WSGA office). **Any item/box of items donated by your organization must clearly have on it the assigned tag and letter code.** Any unlabeled donations will be added to the overall collection total, but not under any specific department/organization.

2. Monetary Donations: Financial donations are just as beneficial to the Pantry as physical items. To donate funds, groups can either submit a check written out to Bods Feeding Bods with your organization/department marked in the note, or visit the online donation site and list the name of the group in those notes. The link for virtual donations will be sent out and posted once active. Checks can be brought to the WSGA office in the Underground Union ***Anyone can make a financial contribution to the competition for any participating group, as long as the organization name is listed in the notes.***

3. <u>Drop-Off Locations:</u> Physical donations may be brought to the WSGA office located in the Underground Union (open M-F 8-5), or to the Bods Feeding Bods food pantry located in Kuehne Hall suite 101 (open M/T/Th/F 8-12, 1-5). There will also be large BFB and Can Emporia barrels around campus and present at some home football games that donations may be left in.

Judging and Scoring:


Each donated item has a point, or "can", amount associated with it. At the end of the collection period, donation points will be totaled and groups with the most amount of "cans" will be given 20 Homecoming points, second place will receive 17 points, and third will receive 14 points. Below is the breakdown of points:

- Cans of up to 16.5oz. count as 1
 - \circ 16.6 to 32.5oz = 2 Cans
 - \circ 32.6 to 48.5 oz = 3 Cans and so on.
- \$1 = 2 Can
- Ramen Noodle Packs = $\frac{1}{4}$ Can (4 Packages = 1 Can)
- Single-serve cups/bowls/bags
 - o Kraft Singles, Rice A Roni cups, tuna salad and such = 1/4 Can
- (4 cups/bowls/bags = 1 Can)
- A Box of Macaroni & Cheese and such = 1 Can
- Jarred Items (Peanut Butter, Mayo, Condiments, Pickles, Etc.)
 - \circ Up to 16.5 oz = 2 Cans
 - \circ 16.6 to 32.5 oz = 3 Cans, 32.6 to 48.5 oz = 4 Cans and so on.
- **Box of Cereal** Standard Size = 2 Cans; Family Size = 3 Cans
- Rice up to 32 oz = 1 Can
 - \circ 32.5 to 64 oz = 2 Cans
- **Box/Bag of Instant Potatoes** = 1 Can

- Hygiene/Toiletry Items
 - o Toothpaste up to 1 oz. = ½ Can; over 1 oz. = 1 Can
 - \circ Toothbrush = $\frac{1}{2}$ Can
 - o Face/Body Wipes regular pack <u>Up to</u> 50 wipes = 1 Can
 - 51 to 100 wipes = 2 Cans and so on.
 - \circ Bar of soap = 1 can
 - \circ Liquid items (Soap, Bodywash, Lotion, etc.) 4 to 20 oz = 1 Can
 - Travel size (up to 3.5oz.) = $\frac{1}{2}$ can; over 20 oz = 2 Cans
- Feminine Hygiene Items $\underline{up to} 20 ct. = 2 Cans$
 - \circ 21 to 40 ct. = 3 Cans
 - \circ 41 to 60 ct. = 4 Cans and so on.
- 1 Notebook/Three-Ring Binder = ½ Can and so on.
- Pack of Pens/Pencils/Highlighters up to 5 ct. = 1 Can
 - \circ 6 to 10 ct. = 2 Cans
 - \circ 11 to 15 = 3 Cans and so on.
- 1 Roll of Paper Towels/Toilet Paper = $\frac{1}{2}$ Can and so on.

- 2. Use of any design that is racially, sexually, religiously, or otherwise offensive
- 3. Depiction of firearms/related weaponry
- 4. Exceed size limits
- 5. Use of glitter, food, or candy
- 6. Failure to meet stated requirements

- Any vehicle towing a trailer will be considered a large float
- The trailer must be no larger than 25 feet long and 11 feet wide
- The height of any float should not be greater than 13 ½ feet from the ground
 - o Including people if standing on elevated portions of the float.

Mini Float: \$500 reward to the winning student organization

• Any decorated vehicle including, but not limited to, cars, trucks, vans, and SUVs

Band:

• A group of musicians who perform during the parade.

Walker:

- Any person or group may walk in the parade
- Walkers are encouraged to carry signs, hand out candy, and/or dress in costumes related to the homecoming theme or Washburn pride

Requirements:

Parade entries must meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Be in parade line-up at assigned time
- 2. Name of the student organization/department displayed
- 3. Washburn spirit, Ichabod pride, and/or homecoming theme displayed
- 4. Decoration of entry can be of the organization's choosing
 - a. Be creative; we encourage the use of streamers, balloons, signs, and other appropriate theme-related decorations
