SENATE RESOLUTION <u>no. 23-24 #003</u> TITLE: First-Generation College Celebration SPONSOR: Martinez/Asamoah Administration STATUS: Campus and Community Affairs-Pending

WHEREAS: November 8th is the anniversary of the signing of the Higher Education Act of 1965 by President Lyndon B. Johnson--focused on increasing postsecondary access and success for students, particularly for low-income and first-generation students; and

WHEREAS: "First-generation college student" means:

- (1) An individual whose parent(s)/guardian(s) did not complete a baccalaureate degree; or
- (2) In the case of an individual who regularly resided with and received support from only one parent, an individual whose parent/guardian did not complete a baccalaureate degree, and

WHEREAS: First-generation college students may face additional academic, financial, and social challenges that lead to disparate outcomes in college access, completion, and labor market outcomes compared to their peers with parents; and

WHEREAS: 56 percent of all college students across the country who are currently pursing degrees are first-generation college students; and

WHEREAS: 1/3 of all community and technical college students identify as First-Generation with a 12.7 percent attaining an associate degree and 11.9 percent attaining a certificate from a community technical college; and

WHEREAS: 57 percent of all public four-year Kansas universities are recognized nationally within the First Scholars Network, which is a national multiphase model for scaling holistic first-generation student success, coordinated by The Center for First-Generation Student Success--an initiative of NASPA (National Association of Student Personnel Administrators); and

WHEREAS: In 2017, the Council for Opportunity in Education and the Center for First-Generation Student Success jointly launched the inaugural First-Generation College Celebration; and

WHEREAS: In 2021, the United States Senate 117th Congress passed Senate Resolution #437 that established First-Generation College Celebration Day throughout the United States to recognize the significant role that firstgeneration college students play in helping to develop the future workforce; and to celebrate the Higher Education Act of 1965; and

WHEREAS: First generation college students focus on transforming our economy, accelerating innovation, and creating a robust talent pool for the future.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE WSGA SENATE:

SECTION ONE: The Washburn Student Organization recognizes November 8th as First-Generation College Celebration Day within the state of Kansas.

SECTION TWO: This bill shall become effective upon the passage of the Senate and bearing the signature of the WSGA President and Vice President.
