## VIII. Public Forum I:

### a. Washburn A.I. Committee, Dr. Worsley and Dr. Kay

- i. They have come to address the concerns about AI. They are working with many different universities on this topic. They are trying to perform higher-level coordination. Their focus is on the classroom and learning environment. Their action plan is to focus on communication plans for campus community, look at policy examinations and ethical considerations, building capacity, and research for common AI tools and governance/infrastructure.
- ii. Senator Bourell: She asked how they address faculty with their AI-related teaching styles.
  - a. Dr. Worsley: She explained that they are questing a baseline for better discussions. She also explained how some careers require knowledge of AI and how it has to be used in specific fields such as medicine.
- iii. Senator Anderson: She asked about the process of the committee if a student is accused by a professor for using AI even when they do not.
  - a. Dr. Worsley: She said they work with faculty and students to see what others might want regarding that situation.
- iv. Senator Smith: He asked if there has been any conversations about making sure faculty are using the same AI platforms?
  - a. Dr. Worsley: They are looking for a university AI checker. They are working currently on the outcomes of AI and education instead.
- v. Senator Bourell: Wanted to know about the ethical considerations.
  - a. Dr. Worsley: They have already changed from fall considerations to spring considerations. There are effects to learning, and she explains whether AI can help or hurt students. There are concerns about displacements of jobs and that AI can amplify bad mindsets.
- vi. Senator Smith: Asked if this addresses faculty?
  - a. Dr. Worsley: Said it is currently about making sure we all have common understandings.
  - b. Smith: What is the priority here?
  - c. Dr. Worsley: She said that these are the discussions they need to work through what the ethical considerations of the

university are

- vii. He says they are trying to get information about the concerns of teachers using AI. What are your concerns about your teachers using it?
  - a. Senator Bourell: Asked what do you do if a student has a learning disability?
  - b. Dr. Worsley: She said she hasn't hear faculty talk about it that way.
  - c. Senator Bourell: Says she is concerned about faculty using AI can be misleading to those with learning disabilities.
- viii. Dr. Kendall: He said they are concerned about student privacy due to these public services.
- ix. Dr. Kay: Says if a faculty uses AI for all classroom activities, it may cause limitations.
- x. Director Redington: What is the plan?
  - a. They are initially working on the outcomes and tagging it onto AI training. They are also working on incentives for people to attend these training.
- xi. Law school representative: He said that when talking about AI literacy it is about using AI effectively but also making sure people understand this technology fails as well.
  - a. Chairperson Ross: Moves to extend public forum
  - b. Motion was seconded
  - c. The public forum was extended
- xii. Chairperson Ross: Asked if there is any research on it?
  - a. Dr. Worsley: Said they are making faculty clearly explain the expectations of the students.
  - b. Ross: If there are professors using AI, do the faculty have to disclose that?
  - c. Dr. Worsley: What does it mean for you to use AI.
  - d. Ross: If I am a professor using AI to create my curriculum, should I disclose that I am doing that. He said he wants to know if a professor does use AI for their class.
  - e. Dr. Worsley: She accepted his feedback.
- xiii. Law School Representative: He said he is writing an article about AI and is astonished that a student would drop a class due to a professor

- using AI. Said he used AI for class exercises because it comes up with things he might not have thought of before.
- a. Ross: He said he wants his professor to give them their knowledge and while they can do it for exercises, he doesn't want them to create slides. He wants to make sure they know what they are teaching if they are only using AI.
- xiv. Senator Anderson: Wanted to know more about student privacy.
- a. Dr. Worsley: It is a huge issue as they don't want the platforms to be in control.
  - b. Anderson: Are there any policies for privacy and how would they respond.
  - c. Dr. Worsley: Said regular laws would apply to it.
- xv. Senator Bourell: Motioned to extend public forum by 10 minutes.
- a. Motion was seconded
  - b. The public forum was extended.
- xvi. Senator Bourell: Wanted to know about career engagement and that we already use it for reviewing resumes.
- a. Dr. Worsley: Said she doesn't know about their set up and won't discuss it.
- xvii. Chairperson Whaley: Yields time to senator Bourell
- a. Senator Bourell: How often do you meet?
  - b. Dr. Worsley: Said they meet very often.
- xviii. Senator Barbery: Wanted to know about other platforms such as Grammarly as some people consider it AI. Wants to know if they are targeting other platforms.
- a. Dr. Worsley: There are many different types, so they are adjusting their views to look at the bigger picture.
- xix. Senator Asfaque: Asked about what happens when it comes to math problems, as professors know when students use AI and want to know how to stop students from using it.
- a. Dr. Worsley: Explained that she wants people to know as they need to know it for the future. Said that everyone has a personal responsibility not to use it.
- xx. Dr. Kendall: Said there are issues on fairness and that policies might need to be applied to assess how students use it and when.
- xxi. Dr. Worsley: Said there are different types when using AI.

- xxii. Director Carpenter: Asked if there is a plan for more student led plans.
  - a. Dr. Worsley: Said there is movement to look at AI literacy usage for students.
- xxiii. Chairperson Brungardt: Asked about social reliance and how people seek companionship and wanted to know how they are looking at it.
  - a. Dr. Worsley: Said it is changing safety and certain degrees, and they are actively looking at it.
- xxiv. Director Redington: Wanted to know if many people are interested in AI literacy certificates.
  - a. Dr. Kendall: Said there are some people interested in it, and it focuses on how they will use this technology.
- xxv. Senator Smith: Motioned to extend the public forum by 5 minutes.
  - a. Motion was seconded
  - b. The public forum was extended.
- xxvi. Senator Smith: Is concerned about professors using AI for grading and is concerned about bias. Also asked about the computer science department's privacy.
  - a. Dr. Kendall: Said they are covering that in the class.
  - b. Senator Smith: Expressed his interest in being on an AI committee.
  - c. Dr. Worsley: Said they are talking about creating a subcommittee.
  - d. Senator Smith: Asked that if they have a complaint, can they raise a complaint about the professor.
  - e. Dr. Worsley: Said it would just be the regular channel for other student concerns.
- xxvii. Senator Adhikari: Motioned to extend public forum by 2 minutes.

WHEREAS, reforming the Funding Policy would promote equitable access to student funds while respecting the time commitments of hardworking students; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the student body that the WSGA Funding Policy be reformed to improve efficiency and accessibility.

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE WSGA SENATE:

#### SECTION ONE: Purpose

The purpose of this legislation is to reform the funding policy to simplify the process for the Allocations Committee while making it easier and more accessible for students to request funding, ensuring that student activity fee funds are used efficiently to benefit as many students as possible.

#### SECTION TWO: Funding Policy Revisions

1. Chapter 4 of the Funding Policy is amended as follows, beginning at subpoint B:
  - b. The Budget Director shall forward all funding request materials to the Allocations Committee Chairperson, who will place the request on the agenda for the Committee's next meeting.
  - c. The Committee will vote to approve or deny the request. If an organization believes its request meets all funding policy requirements but is not approved, the Committee's decision may be appealed to the full Senate on the same day.
    1. The organization must send a representative or a previously approved written statement to the Allocations Committee meeting following the submission of its request, and the representative must speak on the request at that meeting. The Budget Director will notify organizations of the required meeting date and time during the week prior. This representative may not be a sworn-in member of WSGA.
    2. The Allocations Chairperson shall report to the full Senate the number of requests approved, and the total amount of funding allocated. The Chairperson may speak on the Committee's behalf regarding any questions about its decisions. Senators may request relevant documents from the

Budget Director, provided that all confidential information pertaining to the requesting organizations is withheld.

### SECTION THREE: Responsibilities

The Budget Director will work with the Legislative Director to update and redistribute the funding policy by February 8, 2026.

The Budget Director will inform all requesting organizations of these changes throughout the Spring 2026 semester and ensure the funding request form and website reflect the updates.

The Communications & Marketing Director will collaborate with the Budget Director to inform the student body of these changes through appropriate communication channels, including but not limited to social media and the blinky board.

### SECTION FOUR: Effectiveness

This legislation shall become effective upon passage by the WSGA Senate, subject to the WSGA President's veto power.
